CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM

- Planning grants are funded by HUD up to \$500,000.
- Funds used to develop a <u>Transformation Plan</u> for the Russell Neighborhood, including Beecher Terrace.
- Focus on housing, people and neighborhood.
- Application submitted on 8/9/2014.
- HUD received 50 applications!
- Awards are anticipated in January 2015.
- 2 years to complete Transformation Plan.

■North: Market Street


South: Broadway


