TRANSFORMING BEECHER TERRACE



Design Principles:

- Improve security (implement CPTED)
- Upgrade housing to modern standards
- Diversify architecture (expand the toolkit)
- Size blocks to be pedestrian-friendly
- Build a new front porch on 9th Street
- Preserve the sense of community
- Make it 'green'



Natural Surveillance

- » New site lighting
- » Pedestrian-scale street lights
- » Security lighting in parking lots
- » Front/back automatic porch lights
- » Remove visual obstructions


